USMS Open Water Award and USMS Long Distance Championship Award - The Long Distance National Championship Award is presented annually to a USMS registered individual or group who has made significant contributions to the success and promotion of USMS Long Distance National Championship events. These events include the Virtual Championship and Open Water events.

Established in 2013, the U.S. Masters Swimming Open Water Service Award honors individuals who have made significant service contributions to promoting and building excellence in USMS open water swimming in the following ways: Embodies the USMS mission, vision, goals, and objectives through open water swimming service; contributes to

open water notably in several roles (i.e., USMS Open Water/Long Distance national committees, LMSC open water/long distance chair, event and/or safety director, official, coach, clinician, and/or volunteer); contributes to open water notably at different levels of USMS (i.e. national, zone, LMSC, and/or local); or demonstrates extraordinary measurable service achievement and impact.

All or a portion of the performance bond shall be returned to the host organization, based upon compliance with the conditions set forth in the event contract.~~
- D. Any other costs that may be reflected in national championship event contracts.

### **307.7.8 Protests**

- A. Any protest arising from an open water championship swim shall be made to the referee within 30 minutes after the release of results at the venue. If results are not released in a timely manner, a protest may be made to the event director in writing within three days after all swimmers are notified of the release of results. **After receipt of a protest, the referee or event director shall have seven days to reply. If the protest is denied by the referee or event director the swimmer will have seven days to appeal in writing to the Long-Distance Committee Chair. The Long-Distance Committee Chair will have seven days to reply.** If the protest is not resolved, the protester may appeal in writing promptly to the Long Distance Committee chair. **Protests against judgment decisions regarding the start, missing a course turn, failure to achieve a cutoff time, or the finish of a race can only be considered by the referee, and the referee's decision shall be final and may not be appealed.**

**Rationale:** Clarifies times allowed for the event director and LDC Chair to respond to protests. Also, adds restrictions on which judgements made during the race may only be protested to the referee. This is similar to language in 102.14.3.

- B** Any protest arising from a virtual championship swim shall be made to the ~~event director~~ **Long Distance Committee Chair** in writing within three days after all swimmers are notified of the release of preliminary results or amendments to the preliminary results. ~~If the protest is not resolved, the protester may appeal in writing promptly to the Long Distance Committee chair.~~ **The final decision for any protest will be determined by the Long Distance Committee Chair. After receipt of a protest, the Long Distance Committee Chair shall have seven days to reply.**

**Rationale:** Changes the authority for resolving protests in virtual events to the LDC Chair and gives the required response time.

- C** **Protests of eligibility to compete in a gender category shall be considered by the Rules Committee in accordance with USMS policy guidelines regarding eligibility of transgender athletes. Athletes shall be permitted to compete in the gender category that corresponds to their USMS registration pending a decision by the Rules Committee.**

**Rationale:** The order of presentation of results need not be the subject of a rule.

  - C. Swimmer's name ~~(as it appears on the USMS membership card).~~
  - D. Age.
  - E. Club (official USMS club abbreviation).
  - F. USMS number.
  - G. Official time/distance or disqualified.

**Rationale:** A swimmer's name can be displayed without regard to how it is shown on the swimmer's membership card. Any ambiguity arising from similar names can be resolved by the swimmer's USMS number. Differentiating between how similar names are presented in the results (e.g., adding a middle initial) can be considered process.

**Rationale:** The order of presentation of results need not be the subject of a rule.

The number of entrants from a club that shall constitute division I (very large), division II (large), division III (medium), and division IV (small) shall be determined by the Long Distance Committee chair and the event host after the event entry deadline.~~

**Rationale:** This is not a rule but rather guidance on preparing and presenting club scores. If and how divisions are created varies from event to event and should be left to the discretion of the National Office.

- B. When a record attempt has been timed to the nearest second, 0.99 second shall be added to the time submitted **and becomes the official time**. When a record attempt has been timed to the nearest tenth of a second, 0.09 second shall be added to the time submitted **and becomes the official time**.

**C. When times are adjusted, the adjusted times are the official times and must be less than the current record to establish a new record.**

**Rationale:** Adjusted times are the official times. To establish a new record, an official time is required.

- D. USMS records for cable swims may not be established by using a swimmer's split time in an individual event. **Swimmers applying for a cable swim record must submit a copy of the application for a Cable Event Record to the Long Distance Committee Chair.**

**Rationale:** Adds the documentation required for applying for a cable event record.
