Chair -

Rules – Submitted to National Office for presentation at the annual Meeting. The August 24 LDC meeting is slated for the LDC Forum. The Forum is open to all USMS members for discussion of LDC proposed rule changes.

Interim Transgender policy - The policy will be in effect for the Portland swim. For the 5k/10/k Virtual Championship the policy changes from prior policy to new interim policy during the event. The NO has advised all committees that if you have any questions or asked questions to refer to Ed and Dawson.

Annual Meeting – Scheduled for Sept. 12-14 in Kansas City, MO Meeting is hybrid and can either attend in person or virtual, whatever is your preference. Members of the LDC are automatic delegates. Let your LMC Chair know of your delegate status.

USMS Relay OCT 24-26– The LDC has been given slot at relay. Linda Irish Bostic has agreed to give the presentation. Linda runs a Master program with 3 pools 30+ workout/week and is a great motivator and dynamic speaker. Our subject is hosting open water clinics, but we can expand a little on this on how to build the club with OW swimmers and Tri's. Bob K, Dave and Catherine will work with Linda on the presentation.

5K/10K National Virtual Championships May 15-Sep.15 – We received a request to look again at changing the time frame for the 5K/10K. Reasons to not change: the numbers are already low and eliminating anyone would not help in growing the event. So far in 2025 5/15 – 6/15 time frame – 15 swimmers submitted results which is comparable to 2023 and 2024 in numbers. The LDC discussed the request and members brought up the warm pool temps, especially in the Southern US. However, the LDC reached consensus to keep the time frame for 2026 as May 15- September 15.

Goals – The committee has done an outstanding job in reaching goals. Successfully removing procedures from the rule book with the 19 rule changes being submitted. Special thanks to Jim and Christy for editing. There is an increase in OWNC participation. I feel it is due to having 2 OWNC at 1 venue. And with the venue easy for travel and close to a metro area. The Portland Swim is unique in terms of distance and being a long-established event. It is also the only OWNC on the west coast this year.

307.3 Site Selection

The manner of site selection for national championships shall be at the discretion of the Long Distance Committee and shall depend upon the championship structure chosen under article 307.2. Should a bidding system be selected, it shall be accomplished in the following manner:

- **307.3.1** Suitable bids shall comply with all applicable USMS swimming and open water and long distance rules, policies, and procedures.
- **307.3.2** All bids shall be submitted to the chair of the Long Distance Committee no later than July 1. If no timely suitable bid is received, the committee shall continue to solicit bids.
- **307.3.3** Championships shall be awarded by the Long Distance Committee one to three years in advance of the national championship event.
- **307.3.4** A three-area award system may be followed for the bidding of open water championships (see Appendix D for map and description of areas). In this system, suitable bids from a qualifying area shall receive preference over bids from other areas.

A. Any protest arising from an open water championship swim shall be made to the referee within 30 minutes after the release of results at the venue. If results are not released in a timely manner, a protest may be made to the event director in writing within three days after all swimmers are notified of the release of results. <u>After receipt of a protest, the referee or event director shall have seven days to reply. If the protest is denied by the referee or event director the swimmer will have seven days to appeal in writing to the Long-Distance Committee Chair. The Long-Distance Committee Chair will have seven days to reply. If the protest is not resolved, the protester may appeal in writing promptly to the Long Distance Committee chair. Protests against judgment decisions regarding the start, missing a course turn, failure to achieve a cutoff time, or the finish of a race can only be considered by the referee, and the referee's decision shall be final and may not be appealed.</u>

- **Rationale:** Clarifies times allowed for the event director and LDC Chair to respond to protests. Also, adds restrictions on which judgements made during the race may only be protested to the referee. This is similar to language in 102.14.3.
 - B Any protest arising from a virtual championship swim shall be made to the event director Long Distance Committee Chair in writing within three days after all swimmers are notified of the release of preliminary results or amendments to the preliminary results. If the protest is not resolved, the protester may appeal in writing promptly to the Long Distance Committee chair. The final decision for any protest will be determined by the Long Distance Committee Chair. After receipt of a protest, the Long Distance Committee Chair shall have seven days to reply.

Rationale: Changes the authority for resolving protests in virtual events to the LDC Chair and gives the required response time.

C <u>Protests of eligibility to compete in a gender category shall be considered by the Rules Committee in accordance with</u> <u>USMS policy guidelines regarding eligibility of transgender athletes. Athletes shall be permitted to compete in the</u> <u>gender category that corresponds to their USMS registration pending a decision by the Rules Committee.</u>

- A. Record times shall be listed in hundredths of a second (two decimal places). If times are tied to the hundredth of a second, the results shall be declared a tie and records should be shared by all swimmers thus tied.
- B. When a record attempt has been timed to the nearest second, 0.99 second shall be added to the time submitted <u>and becomes the</u> <u>official time</u>. When a record attempt has been timed to the nearest tenth of a second, 0.09 second shall be added to the time submitted <u>and becomes the official time</u>.

C. <u>When times are adjusted, the adjusted times are the official times and must be less than the current record to establish a new record.</u>

Rationale: Adjusted times are the official times. To establish a new record, an official time is required.

308.1.5 Cable Swims

- A. Cable swim records may be made only in stationary, fresh water. No cable swim records will be recognized in any kind of sea or ocean water.
- B. The official time for establishing records shall be achieved and deter- mined in accordance with articles 303.7.1A and 303.7.4.
- C. Swimmers must wear category I swimwear as defined in article 303.4.2 to be eligible for USMS records.
- D. USMS records for cable swims may not be established by using a swimmer's split time in an individual event. <u>Swimmers</u> applying for a cable swim record must submit a copy of the application for a Cable Event Record to the Long Distance <u>Committee Chair.</u>

Rationale: Adds the documentation required for applying for a cable event record.
