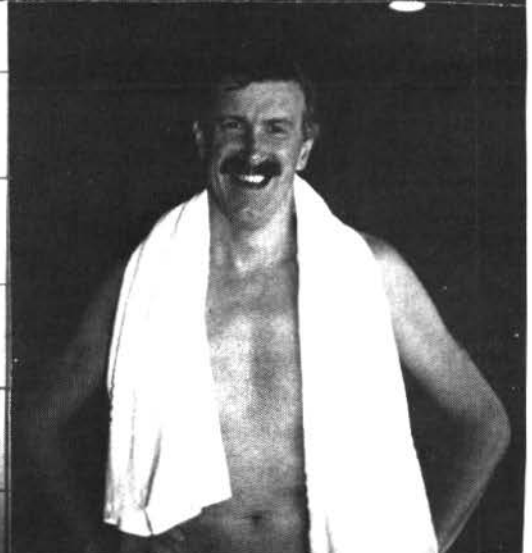
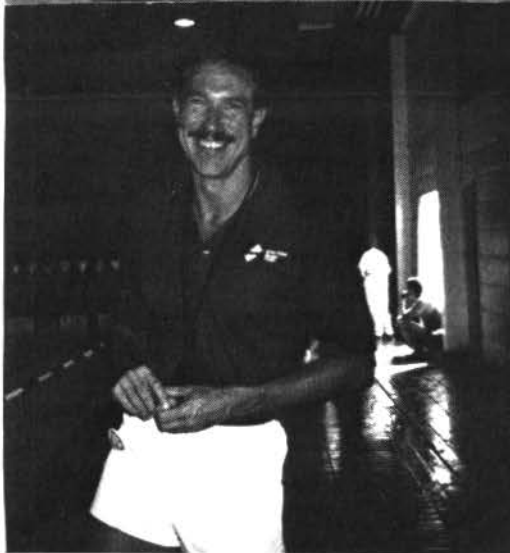

## THE SECOND WORLD MASTERS GAMES DENMARK 1989

The Second World Masters Games, one of the largest sports events to be held in the world, took place on one of the smallest countries in the world---Denmark---from July 22 to August 6, 1989. Denmark was host to more than 6,000 athletes ranging in age from 25 years to 90 plus, who came from some forty countries to compete on the playing fields in the cities of Herning, Aalborg and Aarhus in forty-eight different sport events, including swimming, cycling, fencing, track, canoeing, hang gliding, soccer, basketball, triathlon, etc., in addition to events for the handicapped.

The World Masters Games were founded on the belief that participation in competitive sports has no age limit; that it should provide a continuum of achievement for men and women who were already recognized athletes, as well as encourage others who aspire to reach their full athletic potential in their chosen sport.

As an entrant in both competitive swimming and synchronized swimming events, I encountered still a third event--an unexpected one--known as "getting to the pool on time". Competitive swimming was held in Aarhus proper at the "Inglesport Center", while Synchro was held in the "Gallerup Badet" facility in the suburbs of Aarhus. Because of the tight scheduling of events, some of them back to back, it was a neat trick to get to the right pool at the right time in the right frame of mind. This was usually accomplished by changing swimwear and "gelling up" en route.

The competitive swimming events had participants from more than thirty nations. The United States had approximately 100 swimmers. There were strong swim teams from Japan and Canada, and even a swimmer from USSR--Estonia, that is.

Synchronized swimming events were well represented by U.S. teams who felt the strong competition from Canada and Switzerland.

A special treat was the participation of former Olympian Dawn Fraser from Australia. Because we swam in similar events, we had the opportunity to swim, chat, cheer, coach and socialize.

The Second World Masters Games just concluded in Denmark demonstrated that men and women from all over the world who have a common interest in sports and standards of achievement can meet in friendly competition enriched by social and cultural exchange.

The World Masters Games Reception Center in the middle of Aarhus was the focal point for posted results of all events, a meeting place for appointments, for trading pins and gossip, and taking in a daily "jazz" concert. The World Masters Games of 1989 ended with a closing ceremony party and genuine camaraderie.

The future of Masters sports looks promising. In 1990, the Third FINA/MSI World Masters Swimming Championships is scheduled for Rio de Janeiro. Looking further ahead to 1993, the Third World Masters Games for all sports is scheduled for Minneapolis, USA. Keep practicing and see you sportside!

Dr. Jane Katz, representing the USA medaled in both competitive swimming and synchronized swimming events, winning the 100, 200, 400, 800 and 1500 meter freestyle events. She also placed second in the synchronized swimming solo and duet championship and third in the team event, representing Manhattan Plaza Masters.
